

Creative Brief

Preach My Gospel was firsted inroduced by President Gordon B. Hinckley in October of 2004. Since then it has become the missionaries tool for helping share the gospel around the world. With the digital world upon us, and with some help from the LDS Church, we have stepped into the possibilities of digitally publishing the book. We have taken our experience as former missionaires and tried to think of ways in which a digital version of the book could add to the experience.

A digital version of the book would allow the church to incorporate much of the digital content that they have produced, giving missionaries more reference material to improve their studying and help them be better prepared for their daily discissions with investigators of the church.

Target Audience

Preach My Gospel has a very wide and unique audience. It is produced in many languages and distributed throughout the globe. It is used by LDS missionaries around the world, and is encouraged to be used by members of the church to help them learn and grow, as well as to prepare the youth of the church for their missionary service in the future.

Persona Profiles:

Mission Presidents - A mission presidents key responsilities are to oversee the missionaries who are assigned to his mission area. They help teach and instruct them in ways of being a more productive and successful missionary. In doing so it is helpful to study from the same content of those you are trying to be an impression on and instruct. Having the same new integration and technology as the missionaries will help them better serve.

Objectives

- Repurpose the print version of Preach

- Include as many multimedia elements that are not available through traditional print or pdf versions

- Find additional ways to engange the participant in the learning experience
- Try to provide a point of view from outside the traditional printing methods

Missionaries - A missionary is asked to serve in the church and help share the message of the gospel with anyone and everyone who is willing to listen to the message they have to share. Preach My Gospel was written to help aid them in their endeavor. It is tool for them to study. It helps them gain a greater understanding of the Gospel of Jesus Christ, and is used to help them prepare lessons for those whom they are sharing their message.

President Jones






Jenny Fletcher






"I am excited to be a missionary, but am not sure I am capable to teach."



Brainstorming Ideas

Here is a list of the ideas we had to achieve our original goal to create a captivating experience for the participant in which they would be more likely to intake the content and learn that which they are to preach.

- Highlighting Allowing the missionary to highlight and have it accessible for later use.
- Text to Voice Read aloud feature that would be useful for missionaries learning languages.
- Map Showing the history of the Book of Mormon
- Voice Recording Ability for missionary to save voice files.
- RSS Feed This allows for many possibilites. Our original idea was for mission Presidents to be able to push notifications and resources to the missionaries in his mission.
- Audio Embedding links to audio files would enhance the user experience. Not only could they read the talks, but they could hear the actual talk given when it was presented live.




 Links to referenced talks - Certain talks are only quoted. Full text links would be available to the missionary for them to read the whole talk.


- Ability to link scriptures to scripture text - Being able to tap on a scripture reference and have it pop up in another window or tab would greatly enhance the user experience.


- Quiz features for memorization We had the idea to try and use a built in feature of the program to help missionaries memorize scriptures and reference.
- Bookmarking Being able to save one's progress and use a bookmark would be beneficial.
- Notes Give the ability to add and save notes to the digital book for future reference.



Sketching the Concept








Along with creating personas, we realized the importance of the presentation of the content. We wanted to follow our original objectives which was to creat a rich, engaging environment for our participants in which they could easily access all of the content and make it as interactive as we could. We made sure that each element we would put into the prototype had a purpose and not 'just because we could'.

We realized there was a lot of content in each section, especially with all of the scripture reference. We wanted to bring all of the content together and make it easily accessible. We weren't quite sure how to do this, so we had to look at many different variations on chapter layouts as you can see above. We weren't sure what was really possible as far as capabilities at this point, we were just trying to think of the best way to present the material.

The incorporation of icons was an idea from the beginning. Our client was very straightforward in tellin us that the color scheme should be kept very close to the original. We realized that with the use of icons, we could incorporate the affordances of certain icons along with the colors that are associated with different sections of the book. In doing so we could make the two work in unison.

Why?

Now that we had come up with ideas that we thought would be great to incorporate into the chapter, we then chose to work with the Aquafadas plug-in for InDesign. We really had no basis on our choice other that the few magazines that we downloaded and reviewed that had been created using this same plug-in.

Not only did we have to learn more about Aquafadas and its capabilities, but we also had limited exposure to Adobe InDesign. This made for an interesting experience.

Pain Points

As we planned out the features that we wanted to investigate, it quickly became apparent that some of the features that we had originally wanted either weren't going to be possible or much harder than we had anticipated.

As you can see here to the right, one of main problems we

had was a lot of the more enhanced features were paid features. It wasn't even possible for us to test these features out in any way. We had many ideas that would have enhanced our project that were not possible.




Another problem that we ran into was the lack of documentation and support given by Aquafadas. They do have a video archive on their website in which they have video tutorials covering simple aspects of the software. There were several instances that we ran into problems or needed some help, and when we went searcing for documentation or videos on the subject, they were nowhere to be found.

One partiular example was when James was researching the RSS capabilites of the plug-in. We were interested in this because we had the idea of giving the Mission Presidents that capability of sending push messages to the missionaries all over the mission and being able to give them daily updates, scriptural inspiration, talks, etc. In this process, James did a great job of researching, but with the lack of documentation and support from Aquafadas, he found out that the feature wasn't going to work. He even sent the company an email requesting a bug fix and further help on the subject. He still hasn't to this point received any response from the company.


When we reunited that same week, we all reported that we had come across multiple issues and had the same complaint of the lack of support given for the software. We then talked of the possibility of looking into switching platforms to go with Mags+ because at the time we were so frustrated. In the end we decided to staty with Aquafadas and push through the pain.

One of our objectives was to make the experience more rich and to make it engaging and interactive for the participant.

- [Color] Color was a key factor. We kept the same look and feel consistent on both platforms while making the boxes interactive.
- [Notes] We wanted missionaries to be able to not only be able to take notes, but be able to save them for future use. John was able to create a JavaScript plugin for this feature that enabled notes to be saved to the device. (The ultimate goal is to incorportate the Gospel Library API allowing the participant to access their notes through the church database.
- [End of Chapter Text] Another challenge we had was how could we incorporate the elements that come at the end of the chapter. There is a lot of text, scriptures and references that often get either forgotten or don't receive the proper emphasis it should receive. One example of this was the 'District Meeting' section. We decided to add this section as a tab that is accessed from the slide out tab. We dd this because it would be easily accessible at any time and would not be stuck at the bottom of the text.

Breakthrough to Success

Header Transitions

In order to keep a sense of navigation, we found it crucial to be able to transition the header text from section to section when dealing with a single-page, scrollable layout.

Indicates the transition of headers as the partici pant scrolls from section to section.


Integration of the notes feature was a huge success.
Unfortuantely, the Aquafadas package doesn't support note taking. John did some research and was able to integrate some Javascript code to be able to take notes and save them so they are not lost once the user exits the program.


Conflicting Menu Items

As we played with the idea of expandable menus, we ran into problems with dead space from the conflict of layers. We were able to use the pop-up feature to incorporate our idea of tabs to enhance usability.

Indicates the dead space on one of our prevous models, causing us to reconsider our approach.








Breakthrough to Success

Media Integration

Using reference made in the text, we gathered assets to provide the participant with the actual media from which the reference was taken.




Looking Back

When working on a project, one can always look back and see things that could have been done better or certain aspects that should have been done another way.

There were many things that we would have loved to incorporate as you can see from the right, however, this doesn't mean that we failed. With the lack of support from Aquafadas, we were not able to incorporate them into the project. We realized that these features were secondary, and we needed to stick with our original goals and objectives and make sure that those crucial features were put into place before we strayed too far into the 'just because we can' region.

We have been fortunate to work with a great client that offers many resources to the process. We have discussed the issue and have plans to work with them in trying to develop a solution that will enable these features.

















Throughout the book we have used a variety of icons and thumbnails that will provide popups to view additional content. In the printed book, the additional content was placed throughout the page, here we have decided to offer a seemless reading experience and allow for the tapping of hyperlinks and icons to bring up the additional infromation. We have done this both to provide a clean look and add additional multimedia content without cluttering up the page.

Colors used on the icons have been taken from the print version of Preach My Gospel in order to maintain familiarity with the print and digital copies.



Along the way we have learned more about Adobe InDesign, the Aquafadas publishing platform, and expanded our vision of how we can take a print medium and produce a product that is both engaging and simple.

We were able to exceed our expectations at times, and at others we fell well short of the final product we were hoping to achieve. After meeting with our client, we were able to gather valuable information on the scope of the project and what they envision the future of this products capability.
